



Previously, Mr. Lindberg served as the Chief of Staff and Chief Strategy Officer at the Export-Import Bank of the United States. As the agency's second-highest ranking official, he was responsible for managing the day-to-day operations of EXIM and advancing strategic initiatives such as new programs focused on "China and Transformational Exports", opening new markets for American Liquified Natural Gas, securing America's supply of Critical Minerals & Rare Earths, and protecting allies in the race to deploy 5G globally.



He also led EXIM's involvement in the execution of the ground-breaking Abraham Accords. Mr. Lindberg earned the Distinguished Service Award, which recognizes distinctive accomplishment and leadership that significantly benefit EXIM and the nation.

Today, Mr. Lindberg serves on the board of directors of the National Association of District Export Councils, the Children's Home Society in South Dakota, and is study group member with the U.S. Global Leadership Coalition's Conservative Foreign Policy Study Group. Mr. Lindberg is also a Senior Fellow with the America First Policy Institute's Center for American Prosperity and has been featured by Fox News, The Washington Times, The Hill, The Daily Caller, and The Federalist for his thought leadership on international affairs. Leading the Beef Industry: NCBA President Update

Todd Wilkinson, President, National Cattlemen's Beef Association

Todd Wilkinson is the current president of the National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) representing beef producers across the United States. He is a co-owner and operator of a commercial cow-calf operation with his son, Nick, in De Smet, South Dakota. He is also a co-owner of Redstone Feeders, a family-owned cattle feeding and finishing operation.

Wilkinson will highlight key initiatives taken on by the NCBA and their impact on South Dakota producers:

1. Animal Disease Traceability in the Cattle Industry - The USDA has proposed changes to EID tagging and identification which will impact cattle operations across the country. The USDA's proposal is for mandatory electronic identification for breeding livestock and dairy cattle. This will replace metal tags with electronic tags, which are designed to speed up reporting for disease outbreaks and isolate impacted cattle at the speed of commerce.



Taking into account extensive producer involvement, NCBA has adopted a policy for voluntary traceability program that goes beyond breeding livestock to the entire beef herd. With a highly mobile population and the issues at the southern border, NCBA is convinced a natural traceability system can reduce the impact of a disease such as Foot and Mouth when it enters the United States.

Wilkinson will provide detail on why this is necessary and the planning and goals for the beef industry including latest efforts to secure appropriation for funding in the farm bill process.


2. Cell Culture Meat - Viewed as a potential game changer to the beef industry, it is imperative to properly label cell cultured meat to ensure consumer transparency. Animal and social activists have proposed placing these products alongside traditional products on the meat counter, but it is certainly important that there is clear labeling to enable consumers to discern between genuine beef and laboratory-grown alternatives.

In addition, Wilkinson has practiced law for more than 40 years, specializing in estate planning and agricultural law. He is a graduate of Augustana College and USD School of Law. His firm, Wilkinson & Schumacher, is sought after by landowners (cow-calf, stocker and feeder segments) across the state when they are facing legal challenges.

Over the years, Wilkinson has been heavily involved in local, state and national leadership roles. During his time on the South Dakota Cattlemen's Association board, he held many roles, including president in 2015-2016. Wilkinson has also served on numerous NCBA committees as well as the Environmental Working Group, Traceability Working Group and Cattle Marketing Working Group. Wilkinson served as NCBA Region VII policy vice president for two years. Wilkinson is a founding member and current vice president of the South Dakota Cattlemen's Foundation.

Todd and his late wife, Jean, have three children and nine grandchildren.

SOYBEAN COMPOSITION



Elaine Kub, South Dakota Economist

Elaine Kub, CFA is the author of Mastering the Grain Markets: How Profits Are Really Made -- a 360-degree look at all aspects of grain trading, which draws on her experiences as a market analyst, grain merchandiser, futures trader, and farmer. Before earning an engineering degree and an MBA, Elaine grew up on a family farm in South Dakota, where she's returned to be an active grain and cattle producer. Her economic analysis can regularly be found in a column for DTN The Progressive Farmer, on public television's Market to Market, and in




consulting projects that help institutions and business owners understand the risks and opportunities within the commodity markets.

The presentation will explore how the present set of commodity market dynamics -- from interest rates and inflation, to geopolitical challenges in the global supply chain -- directly affect rural communities.

The dollars and cents paid for a bushel of corn or spent on a gallon of diesel or a ton of fertilizer can sharply influence the profitability of family farmers. Therefore, commodity market volatility affects every aspect of the agricultural industry, and a full summary of market conditions can help industry participants plan for the future.

Sam Kieffer, Vice President, Public Policy, AFBF

Dr. Erin Cortus



Erin Cortus joined the Department of Bioproducts and Biosystems Engineering at the University of Minnesota in August 2017. Her position as Associate Professor and Extension Engineer is to provide engineering expertise in the area of sustainable animal agriculture systems. Erin was born and raised in Saskatchewan, Canada. She earned her Bachelor of Agricultural and Bioresource Engineering degree and PhD at the University of Saskatchewan. Dr. Cortus also has eight years of experience in a similar Research and Extension role at South Dakota State University. The broad mission of Dr. Cortus' program

is to work with producers and communities to understand and continually improve the quality and productivity of livestock environments. Her past and ongoing projects include measuring the air quality impacts of different manure management practices in swine, poultry, dairy and beef cattle barns, and navigating the science and communication aspects of sustainable livestock production.

Lynn Boadwine



Established in 1874 by Lynn Boadwine's great-grandparents, Boadwine Farms Inc has grown with each generation through the family's passion for dairy and beef production, their openness to embrace new technologies and techniques, and their emphasis on continuous training and skill development for their 65 employees. In the late 1980s, the farm had 40 milking cows. By 2000, the farm had grown to 600 milking cows. Today, Boadwine Farms Inc prides itself on caring for over 4,100 Holstein dairy cows. In 2020, Boadwine partnered with Brightmark Energy to begin the Athena renewable natural gas project. This initiative utilizes methane digesters to convert manure

into renewable natural gas, enhancing the farm's sustainability efforts.

David Skaggs



David Skaggs joined Agrovive Biologicals in June 2022 as the Dairy Project Manager, overseeing field and research projects in the United States and Canada. Agrovive Biologicals is at the forefront of utilizing Microbes to increase and enhance plant growth and yield and reduce the greenhouse gas footprint. Several studies have been conducted over the last year, including documented studies showing a reduction of enteric methane in the cow's rumen

and manure greenhouse gas footprint. Prior to joining Agrovive, David was the Dairy Development Specialist for the South Dakota Department of Agriculture for 14 years, growing South Dakota Dairy & Livestock Farms and Industry Partners. During his time with the South Dakota Department of Agriculture, he had the opportunity to travel around the country recruiting dairy families and seeing first-hand how farmers are always looking to make the best decisions for their families and their communities. Born and raised on a registered Simmental & Shorthorn beef herd in Northern Michigan, he attended Michigan State University where he earned his degree in Livestock production.



In 1929, Alfred Nef and Alfred Gonzenbach founded Valley Queen Cheese in Milbank, South Dakota.




