





Agricultural Law, and has also served as a visiting professor at the Drake University Law School. In addition, he has taught Environmental and Natural Resources Law and Introduction to Agricultural Law in the Dale Bumpers College of Agricultural, Food, & Life Sciences, Department of Agricultural Economics and Agribusiness. In that role, he was awarded the 2011-2012 Agricultural Business Club Teaching Award.





Erik Gerlach State Statistician, USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service


South Dakota State Statistician Erik Gerlach will provide an overview of the census data and trends specific to South Dakota and the Midwest.

# Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) update: Poultry and Mammals Dr. Beth Thompson

Dr. Beth Thompson State Veterinarian, South Dakota Animal Industry Board

Highly pathogenic avian influenza is caused by a virus readily spread by wild water fowl and other birds. While the virus is lethal to domestic poultry, the affects in other species is not as devastating. Dr. Thompson will give an update of HPAI in the US and specifically in SD, discussing USDA's response and work done in SD.

Dr. Thompson joined the South Dakota Animal Industry Board in May 2022 and serves as the SD State Veterinarian and Executive Secretary for the Animal Industry Board. Her duties also include serving as the director of the SD Veterinary Licensing Board.

Dr. Thompson earned her DVM from the University of MN College of Veterinary Medicine, and also earned a certificate in Swine Medicine. After veterinary school, she worked for a MN based swine system. She joined the MN Board of Animal Health in 2008 as a senior veterinarian and served as the MN State Veterinarian from 2016 – 2022.

In addition to her duties at the Animal Industry Board and as the executive secretary for the SD Veterinary Licensing Board, Dr. Thompson is in leadership



in the United States Animal Health Association (USAHA) and is the president of the National Association of State Animal Health Officials. She is the chair of the AVMA Animal Agriculture Liaison Council, and a variety of emergency planning groups. She is the past chair of the USAHA Cattle/Bison committee and the Tuberculosis subcommittee.

In addition to her veterinary degree, Dr. Thompson has a Juris Doctorate in 1992 from William Mitchell College of Law. She is originally from Groton, SD.
