

USDA Update Recorded Statement - Tentative Secretary Tom Vilsack, U.S. Department of Agriculture



National Corn Growers Association


Angus R. Kelly will discuss the anticompetitive practices affecting South Dakota producers and share insights on how farmers and ranchers can fight against these practices to ensure their operation stays viable.

Angus was born in rural South Carolina to a preacher and a teacher and spent his summers working in cotton and corn fields, eventually

taking him to N.C. State University to study Agribusiness, History, and French. Upon graduation, his heart led him to agricultural development with the U.S. Peace Corps in West Africa. Following his service, Angus joined the government and regulatory affairs team at the National Cotton Council in Washington, D.C. Later recruited by an agrochemical and seed company, he spent a dozen years with Syngenta first as a lobbyist and then in leadership roles from the European Union to Hawaii to Switzerland where he managed corporate affairs for Africa and the Middle East.



Over the years Angus continued his education at Stanford, the Graduate Institute of Geneva, and INSEAD France. With ink in his blood, he's collaborated on stories ranging from Reuters, Jeune Afrique, The Wall Street Journal, Inside U.S. Trade to The Times of London. Today, Angus and his family live in Washington, D.C. where he manages the National Corn Growers Association trade portfolio.

Reimagining Federal Conservation Programs

Greg Ibach, Secretary-in-Residence at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln



The farm bill, which primarily affects the USDA, is passed roughly every five years, and has a tremendous impact on farmers and

ranchers across the country. The current farm bill will expire in 2023 and discussions are already underway to plan for the next one. Most expect conservation and climate programs to be heavily emphasized in the next farm bill and many worry an emphasis on new, climate related efforts will ignore proven conservation practices already in place. In South Dakota, many farmers and ranchers currently use sustainable practices on their land, such as rotational grazing, no-till farming, buffer strips, or cover crops. Mr. Ibach will explain how producers who incorporate new and existing



conservation practices in their operations could be recognized and rewarded for their efforts by the next farm bill. He will also discuss reimagining federal conservation programs and how producers can use outcome driven data to enhance their operation while protecting and preserving our environment and natural resources.

Orland Ridge Dairy

Tour Location

Orland Ridge Dairy is a 1,550-head robotic milking facility near Madison operating 24 Lely box robotic milking systems. They currently produce 30 million pounds of milk per year, with their product transported to a cheese plant in Lake Norden, SD.

Orland Ridge Dairy is in the process of expanding the facility to a 3,100-head operation with 48 Lely robots. A single Lely robot can sustain 70 cows, milked 2-3 times in a 24-hour period.



The cows are free to visit the robotic milker on their own initiative. Once the cow enters the Lely robot, a sensor recognizes her and stores essential data for the operator. The udder is cleaned and disinfected, and a laser identifies the correct location for the robot to attach to the teats and begin milking. The milking process is fully automated, offsetting the challenge of a limited workforce.

The barn is equipped for cow comfort with a free-flow pen design to avoid the need for gates during pen cleanings. The barn is cross-ventilated and incorporates automatic scrapers for the alleys. Their nutrient management plan (NMP) includes a manure separator with some waste being recycled for bedding.

Swine Education and Research Facility

The SDSU Swine Education and Research Facility exposes students to real-world swine industry teaching and research experiences. Consisting of three buildings, including a Sow Teaching and Intensive Research Complex, On-Site Wean-to-Finish Research Barn, and an Off-Site Wean-to-Finish Production Barn.

The facility allows pigs to be brought into the classroom to support teaching and discussion, observation windows and an elevated walkway allowing visitors to view the modern production process, and a surgical suite, capable of surgical procedures on pigs from 10 to 500 lbs. A pass-through window connects the Boar Collection Room with a Semen Processing Lab, allowing students to learn about industry standards for artificial insemination techniques. The facility also has two farrowing rooms and 36 gestation stalls with individual feeders.

Animal Disease and Research Diagnostic Lab

The SDSU Animal Disease Research and Diagnostic Lab (ADRDL) was renovated in 2015 to expand research functions and provide additional space for partnering with regional veterinary schools in the Midwest. The ADRDL plays a critical role in defending South Dakota's livestock industry against disease, provides crucial diagnostic information about the state's wildlife and companion animals, and safe-guards human health by dealing with food safety issues and zoonotic diseases.


