ARBOR DAY CREATIVE WRITING CONTEST

JUDGING CRITERIA

The local conservation districts will do initial judging. They are each asked to select one local winner and submit it to the state contest. SDACD, Resource Conservation & Forestry Division, and other organization representatives will do judging at the state level. To assure uniformity, the judging will be based on seven categories with two categories receiving more weight than others. For each creative writing entry, a score of 1 to 10 should be assigned to each of the seven categories keeping the following rating system in mind:

Point Value	Rating Description
1 or 2	Poor
3 or 4	Substandard
5 or 6	Fair or Average
7 or 8	Good or Above Average
9 or 10	Excellent or Superior

The seven categories to be rated and their respective weights are as follows:

1. Originality and Creativity	40 %
2. Effectiveness and Clarity	30 %
3. Spelling and Punctuation	10%
4. Appropriateness of Theme	5 %
5. Accuracy of Information	5 %
6. Neatness	5 %
7. Grammatical Usage	5 %

To score a creative writing entry, assign a point value of 1 to 10 for each of the seven categories. Treat each entry as objectively and fairly as possible. In the case of tie scores, another scorer should be called upon to rate the tied entry and, hopefully, break the deadlock.

Example of scoring:

1. Originality	8 x 10 = 80	80 x 40% =	32
2. Effectiveness	9 x 10 = 90	90 x 30% =	27
3. Spelling/Punctuation	5 x 10 = 50	50 x 10% =	5
4. Appropriateness of Theme	$7 \times 10 = 70$	70 x 5% =	3.5
5. Accuracy	10 x 10 = 100	100 x 5% =	5
6. Neatness	6 x 10 = 60	$60 \times 5\% =$	3
7. Grammatical Usage	8 x 10 = 80	80 x 5% =	4
TOTAL			79.5

This creative writing entry received a score of 79.5 of a possible 100 points.
