White Horehound

(Marrubium vulgare)







Roots: taproot, branched, woody, with numerous fibrous lateral roots

Stems: dense, white woolly 4-angled stems branching from a somewhat woody base

Leaves: opposite, round to oval in outline, corrugated (wrinkled), pale green above and white woolly beneath, with coarsely-toothed margins

Flowers: small white tubular

Origin: Europe
