#### Additional Project Guidelines

- Proposals will not be funded if they:
  - Fail to directly address and demonstratively enhance the competitiveness of eligible specialty crops,
  - Focus on or primarily benefit ineligible crops, or
  - Solely benefit a single producer, organization, or business.
- Applicants should incorporate outreach into their projects to disseminate results
- Extra consideration will be given to projects that address SD priorities and are below \$75,000
