# **Executive Summary Coordinated Natural Resources Conservation Fund**

The Coordinated Natural Resources Conservation Fund was established by the State Legislature in 1992 to implement goals and objectives identified in the South Dakota Coordinated Plan for Natural Resources Conservation. The plan targets reduction of soil erosion, improvement of rangelands, improvement of water quality and quantity, enhancement of wildlife habitat, increased public awareness of natural resources, funding, and use of renewable energy.


Funding for the Coordinated Natural Resources Conservation Fund is provided by state law SDCL 10-47B-149. This law states \$500,000 will be deposited into the Coordinated Natural Resources Conservation Fund on July 1 of each year.

The Coordinated Natural Resources
Conservation Fund is used to provide
cost share grants to South Dakota
conservation districts. Grant
applications are reviewed, approved,
and awarded by the State
Conservation Commission. The
Division of Resource Conservation
and Forestry administers
conservation programs on behalf of
the state and the Conservation
Commission.

- Every \$1 of conservation funds was matched by \$3.20 of other funds
