1st. The equivalent of at least one-fifth of the work above specified is to be completed on or before Feb. 20, 1910.

2d. The whole of said work is to be completed on or before August 20 1912.

3d. The limit of time for proof of beneficial use of water appropriated in accordance herewith is August 20 1912.

4th. The water appropriated shall be used for the purpose of Irrigation.

5th. The prior right of all persons who, by compliance with the laws of the State of South Dakota, have acquired a right to the use of water must not be injuriously affected by this appropriation.

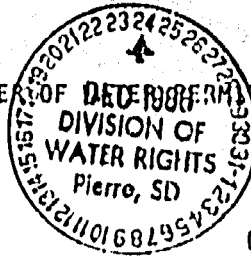
