

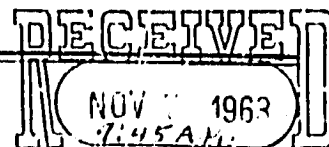

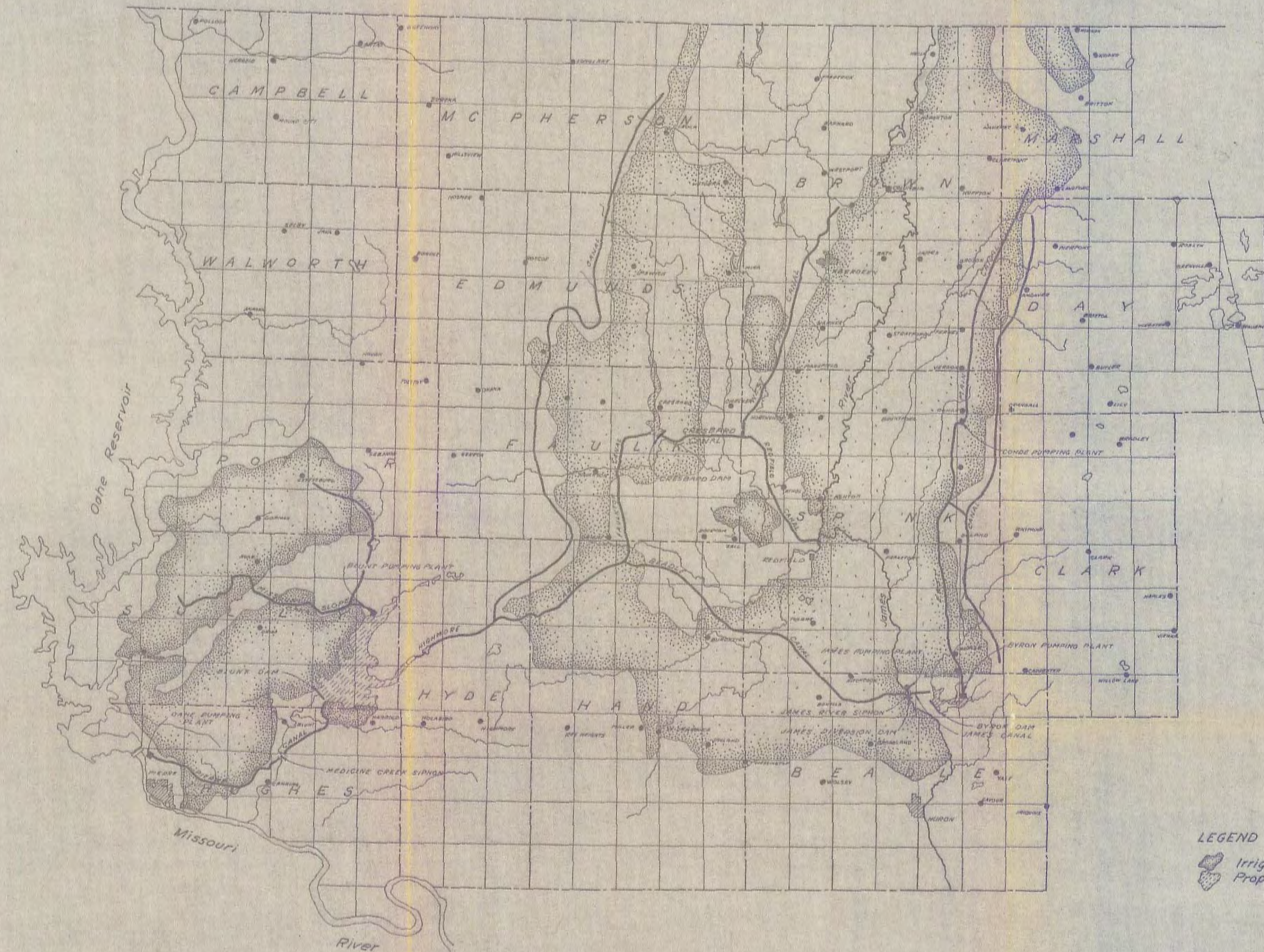

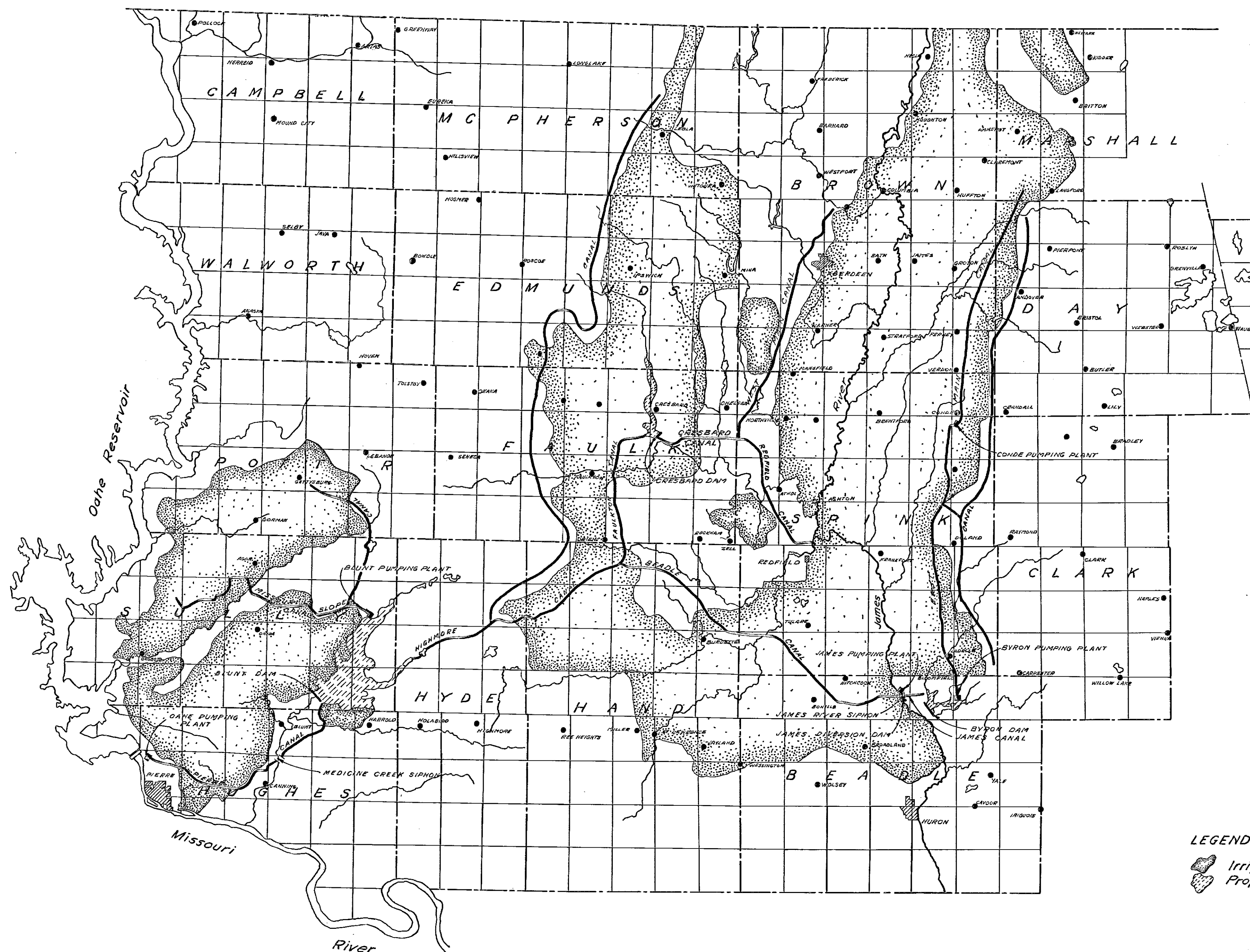

(1) The Oahe Conservancy Sub-District was created in 1960, under provision of Chapter 61.14, 1960 Supplement to the South Dakota Code of 1939, as amended. The Sub-District is filing this application under the authority granted in Chapter 61.01, 1960 Supplement to the South Dakota Code of 1939, as amended. Authorization for filing this application granted by the Oahe Conservancy Sub-District Board of Directors at the August 8, 1963, Board Meeting. (See copy of August 8 minutes accompanying this application - Attachment A. Motion appears on pp. 204, paragraph 6.)

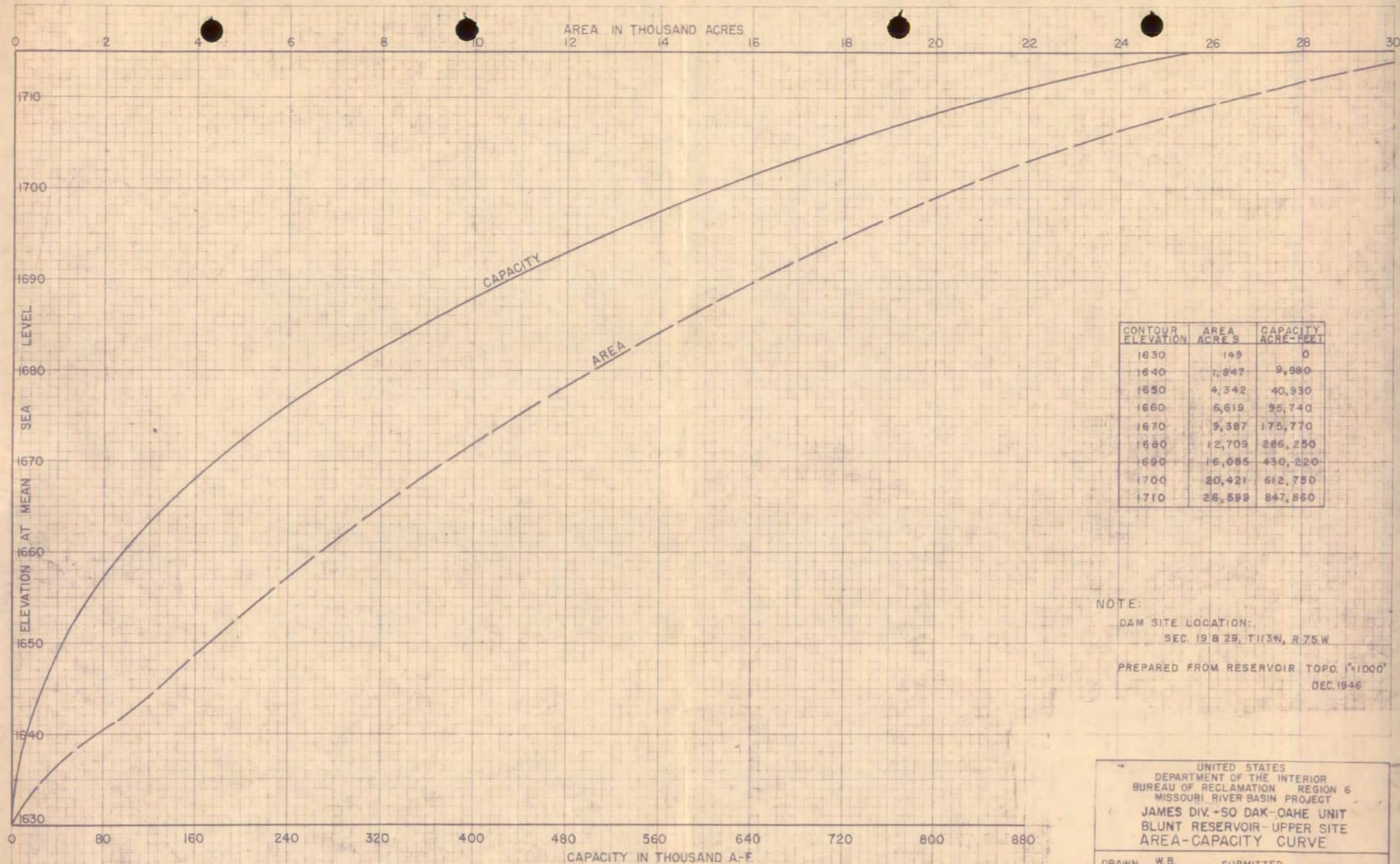

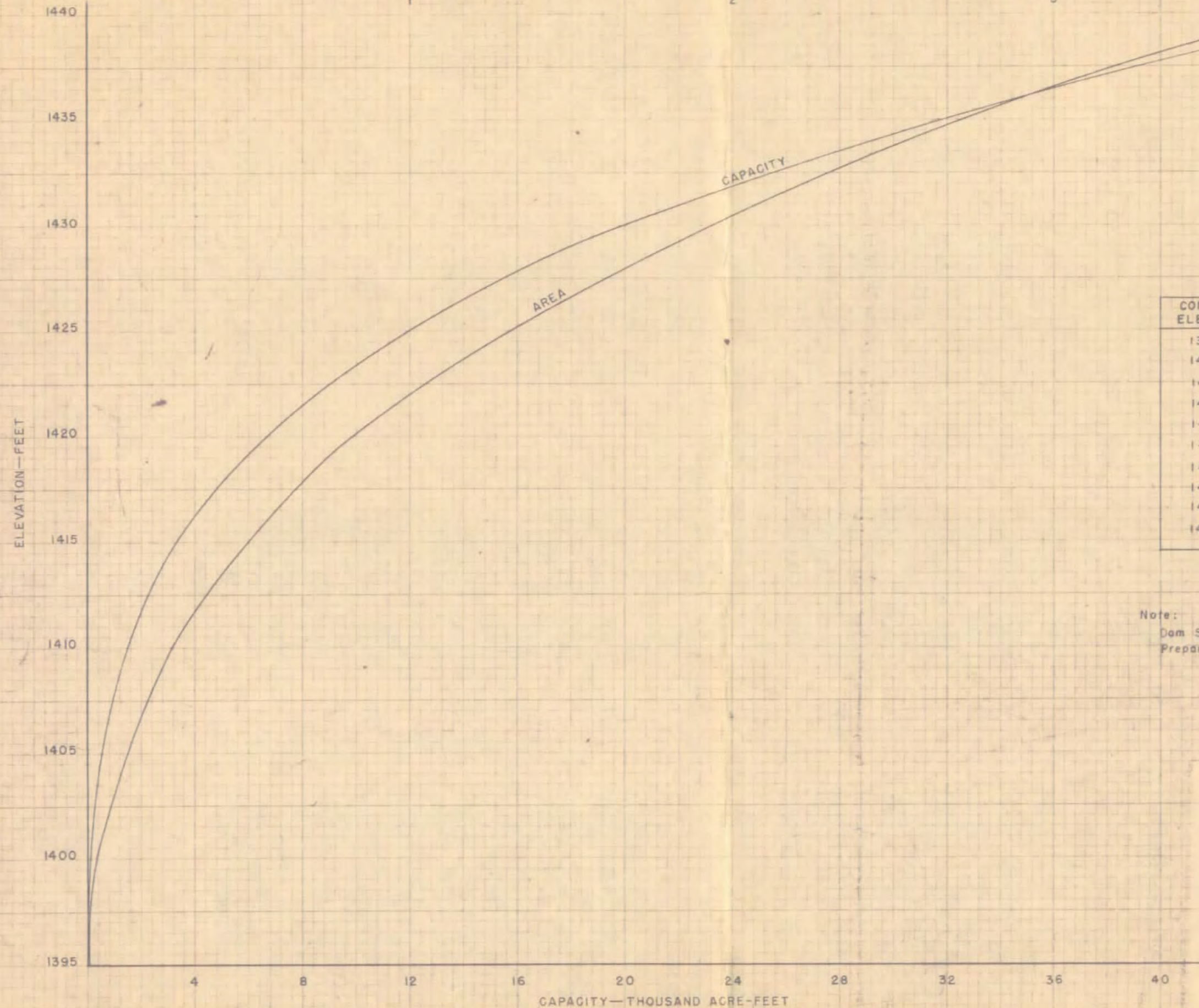

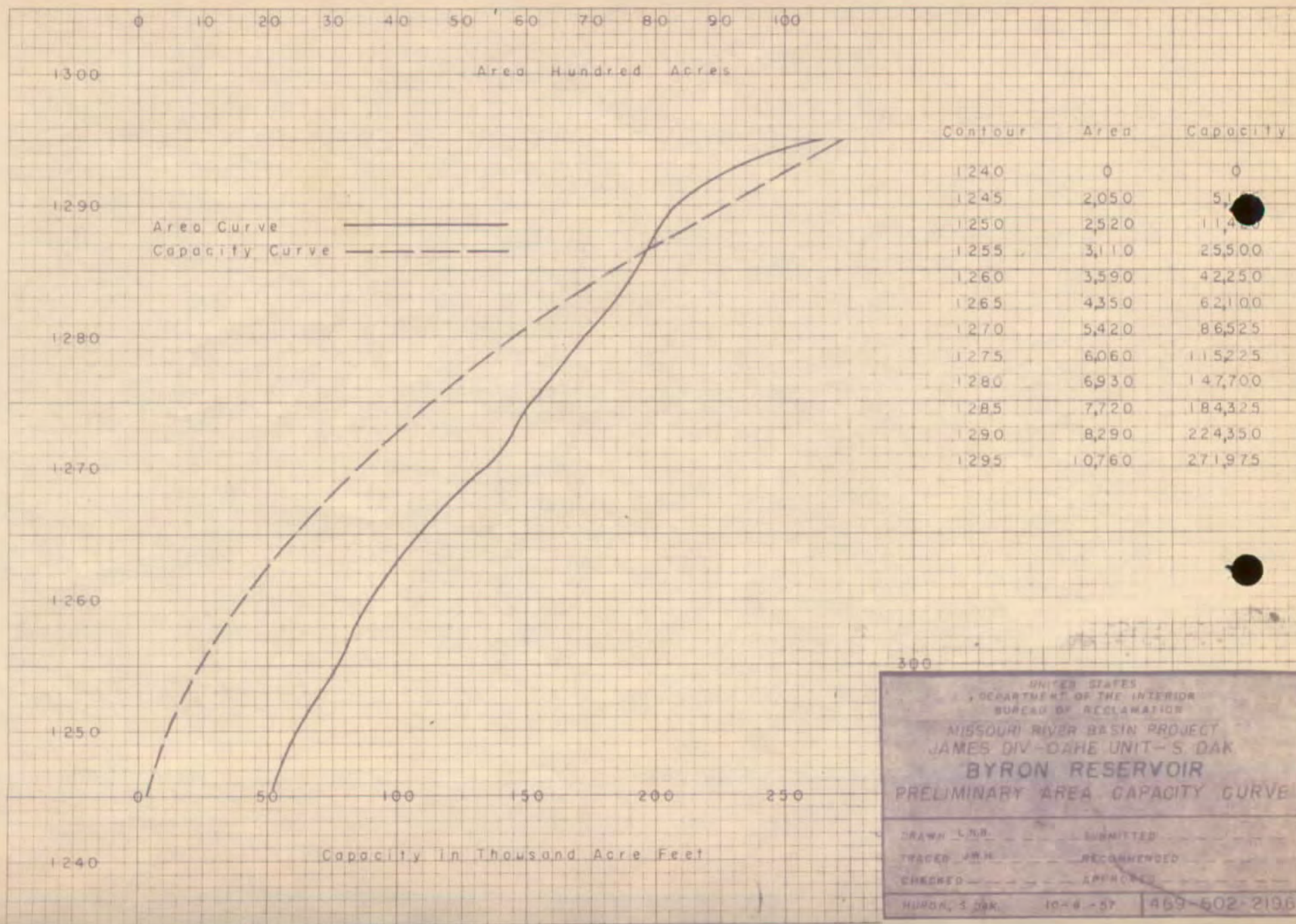

IPSWICH, SOUTH DAKOTA

The regular meeting of the Oahg Conservancy Sub-District Board of Directors was held in the P.E.M., P.L.A. Building, Ipswich, South Dakota, August 8, 1963.

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 A.M. by Chairman Holscher. Mr. H.A. Beck, Mayor of the City of Ipswich was introduced and extended words of welcome to the directors.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Chairman Holscher recommended that a closed executive session of the Board be held to discuss and decide upon a new location for the Sub-District office.

Mr. Hundstad moved, seconded by Mr. Hill, that a closed executive session of the Board be inaugurated for the purpose of discussing the relocation of the Sub-District office. Motion carried.

Considerable discussion followed, during which each director was called upon to express his views, and representatives from the Aberdeen Chamber of Commerce were heard. It was determined that a decision should be reached by ballot.

Mr. Ruddy moved, seconded by Mr. Roesch, that the Board of Directors decide upon a temporary office site for the Sub-District by a majority vote of the directors polled by means of a secret ballot. Motion unanimously carried.

Results of the election showed Huron receiving a majority vote. Vote tellers were Mr. Melvin Roesch and Mr. Wendell Lewis.

The staff was directed to take steps to comply with the decision reached.

Meeting recessed at 11:30 A.M. for luncheon.

Chairman Holscher reconvened the meeting as a general session at 1:00 P.M.

MUNICIPAL WATER

Mr. Leonard Nelson, representing the City of Ipswich, enumerated, with the aid of a slide presentation, that city's municipal water supply problems.

In stressing the urgent need for an additional municipal water supply, the following factors were advanced:

1. In the last three years, water hookups have increased from 365 in 1960 to 425 in 1963.
2. During 1961, 1962 and 1963, 24 new houses have been or are being built in Ipswich. Six new business places have been constructed and over 20 trailer homes have moved into town.
3. The present water supply consists of the one well 1-1/2" in diameter, 1200 feet deep and one 2" well 1700 feet deep. Total pump capacity for the two wells is 47 gallons per minute.
4. The present supply is not adequate. Even with the abnormal rainfall this year, the water shortage tanks have been emptied in less than two hours from 6:00 to 8:00 P.M. in the evening.
5. The present water supply is of a poor quality, in that it contains excess total solids of irons and sulfates.

In conclusion, Mr. Nelson requested assistance from the Sub-District in making a determination of water supply resources possible for the city's municipal use.

It was concluded that two potential sources existed which could possibly satisfy the city's need--those sources being ground and surface water.

A survey of the surface water potential will be initiated by the Oahe Sub-District in conjunction with the Soil Conservation Service, as a part of the Basin Study, which is now in progress.

It was also explained that the responsibility of determining ground water potential lies with the State Geological Survey and that the initiation of such a study begins with a request from the city affected. The Board recommended that an immediate application for a ground water study be made by the City of Ipswich. The city was assured that when and if such an application was made, the Oahe Sub-District would do everything possible to stress the necessity of such a study at the earliest possible date.

GENERAL BUSINESS

Mr. Hill moved, seconded by Mr. Jessen, that the minutes of the June 13 Directors' Meeting be approved as written. Motion unanimously carried.

A report was given by the Manager bringing the directors up-to-date on the progress of irrigation district formation and of the Pollock-Herreid Irrigation District.

The status of the Central Coordinating Committee, which will be organized to coordinate the various studies of Federal, State and local agencies interested in water resource development in the James River Valley, was also reviewed. The State Conservancy District Board has accepted the chairmanship of the committee and the initial meeting will be held this fall.

The Board authorized the reimbursement of the following expenses incurred by directors engaged in official Sub-District business other than the regularly-scheduled Board of Directors' meetings.

Mr. Jessen moved, seconded by Mr. Garrett that travel expenses be allowed for Messrs. Hundsvad, Miller and Chairman Holscher's attendance at the August 1 meeting of the Sub-District Executive Committee held in Redfield. Motion unanimously carried.

Mr. Garrett moved, seconded by Mr. Jessen, that both travel expenses and the payment of per diem be allowed for Chairman Holscher's attendance at the Agricultural Coordinating Committee meeting held in Huron on July 29. Motion unanimously carried.

Mr. Jessen moved, seconded by Mr. Garrett, that both travel expenses and the payment of per diem be allowed for

Messrs. Renz, Miller and Chairman Holscher's attendance at the July 24 Master Contract Review meeting held in Pierre. Motion unanimously carried.

Mr. Miller moved, seconded by Mr. Garrett, that Mr. Hundstad be reimbursed for the actual initial expense incurred by his attendance at the irrigation tour to Scottsbluff, Nebraska, on July 10. Motion unanimously carried.

A new method for initiating the payment of directors' per diem for attendance at regular and special meetings was explained. Instead of the individual per diem vouchers as has been the procedure in the past, one voucher will be submitted covering all the directors' per diem claims. The procedure for submitting per diem claims for official Sub-District functions other than Board of Directors' meetings will remain the same.

APPROPRIATION OF WATER FOR FUTURE USE

In keeping with the State Water Rights Law, which provides that a Sub-District may appropriate a reasonable amount of water for its contemplated future needs, the Oahe Sub-District is considering taking the necessary action to secure such rights for the proposed Oahe Unit. An application must be filed with the Water Resources Commission in the same manner as provided for the appropriation of water for existing needs. In making such an application, the Sub-District must take into consideration future needs over and above those anticipated at the present time. It was recommended that the 3,200 cfs diversion rate specified by the Bureau of Reclamation from the Oahe Reservoir, and the 2,000 cfs diversion rate from the James River be increased to provide water for additional irrigable land which may be developed, over and above the 482,000 acres now proposed, and for other future beneficial water uses.

It must be realized that a large portion of the diversion from the James River would be flood flows and possible irrigation return flows. These flows would be diverted for storage into the Byron Reservoir. It was proposed that the diversion rate requested be increased to 5,500 cfs from the Oahe Reservoir and 5,000 cfs from the James River.

Mr. Jessen moved, seconded by Mr. Garrett, that the Oahe Conservancy Sub-District make application to the Water Resources Commission for an appropriation of water for the future use of the Oahe Unit in an amount determined reasonable for future needs. Motion unanimously carried.

Mr. Grimes indicated that water diversion rates which may be obtained are achieved by considering the least of the following:

1. that rate which is requested on the application;

2. that which the system's capacity is able to divert;
3. total irrigable acreage divided by 70, with due allowance for loss.

The staff asked for authority to hire a consulting engineering firm to draft the map which, according to law, must accompany the application. Such a map must be signed by a registered land surveyor or government engineer.

Mr. Ruddy moved, seconded by Mr. Roesch, that the manager employ the services of a private engineering firm of his choice, to prepare the necessary technical material which is required to accompany the application for an appropriation of water for future use. Motion unanimously carried.

MASTER CONTRACT

Mr. Renz reported on the contract review meeting held in Pierre on July 24 with Mr. Bielfeld. This meeting has been arranged at the request of the directors at the June 13 directors' meeting, to further review the contract draft in an attempt to determine its legal sufficiency under State and Federal law.

He stated that he is now satisfied with the contract insofar as its relationship with State and Reclamation law is concerned. He did feel there was one change which should be made. In Article 8(d), Page 13 of the proposed Master Contract, a change in the method of payment should only be made with the prior consent of the affected irrigation district.

It was determined that the manner in which the financial obligations of the Sub-District are stated need to be expressed more specifically. The particular point at issue is the estimated cost for operation and maintenance of the Oahe Reservoir.

Mr. Hipple moved, seconded by Mr. Jessen, that the Bureau of Reclamation be requested to modify the contract language with respect to the definition of the Oahe Reservoir as it appears in definition (i) on Page 3, in such a manner as to place a limitation on the obligations to be incurred by the Oahe Conservancy Sub-District for the costs of operation and maintenance of the Oahe Reservoir. Motion unanimously carried.

Mr. Hipple further moved, seconded by Mr. Miller, that the Board of Directors request the Bureau of Reclamation to submit the draft of proposed Master Contract, as it may be modified, to Washington for the comments of the Secretary of the Interior to the end that the Oahe Sub-District Board of Directors may be informed as to whether or not the contract is satisfactory as to form. Motion unanimously carried.

BASIN STUDY

Mr. Huxtable reported that the Basin Study is proceeding ahead of schedule. The first stage of their studies is progressing well and they have started some of the second stage evaluations. Areas which have been studied are Wolf and Turtle Creeks and Elm River. A possible reservoir site to provide storage for a municipal water supply for the City of Miller has been under investigation.

The studies of Elm River are progressing with a view towards a municipal water supply for Aberdeen and providing a degree of flood protection.

AGENCIES' REPORTS

Mr. Wilson from the Extension Service, explained a new educational approach which has been developed for use in counties which do not at the present time, receive direct benefits from the Cahe Unit. A program will be initiated by which with the aid of specially prepared questionnaires, the county water resource development committees can determine a long range water resource program for their particular county. The questionnaires which were distributed to the directors cover the whole area of water resource development. The county water resources committees will submit the completed reports to the Sub-District Board and in this way, all the counties within the Sub-District will provide the directors with a long range plan as to what the various counties' feelings are in relation to water resource development.

Mr. Von Seggern reported on the results of a study conducted by the Bureau of Reclamation to determine the irrigation feasibility on certain parcels of land in McPherson and Campbell Counties. These studies were initiated as a result of petitions presented to the Cahe Sub-District at the June 13 meeting, asking assistance in requesting the Bureau to undertake such studies. Investigations revealed that the elevation of the lands in question is considerably higher than the source of water and is too high to make any project development feasible. It would not be practical to make additional detailed investigations.

DIRECTORS' REPORTS

Mr. Garrett reported that plans are underway to organize a tour, for Sully County farmers and businessmen, of the Hans Jessen farm to view his methods of irrigation.

Mr. Hundstad briefly reviewed the irrigation tour to Scottsbluff, Nebraska.

Chairman Holscher discussed the possibility of scheduling the Board meetings for two days instead of one, when the situation demands. The meeting could convene at Noon on the first day, and continue through the morning of the second. This would be dictated by the amount of business to come before the Board at each particular meeting and will be left up to the discretion of the Manager.

RESOLUTIONS

Mr. Hill, Chairman of the Resolutions Committee, moved adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, The Oahe Conservancy Sub-District Board of Directors concluded a most pleasant and profitable meeting in Ipswich; now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Oahe Sub-District Board of Directors that they express their appreciation to the directors of the F.E.M. Rural Electric Cooperative Association for making the meeting room available and for providing coffee and cookies.

Motion to adopt the foregoing resolution was seconded by Mr. Hipple. Motion unanimously carried. Resolution adopted.

Having no addition business to come before the Board, Chairman Holscher adjourned the meeting at 4:30 P.M.

CONTRACT PRINCIPLES -- OAHE UNIT
MISSOURI RIVER BASIN PROJECT -- SOUTH DAKOTA

Types of Contracts

Three principal types of contracts are proposed for construction of the Oahe Unit and for operation and maintenance of the project works.

A. A Master Contract will be negotiated between the United States and the Oahe Conservancy Sub-District covering:

1. Water supply works, which are the portions of the project works serving several areas or several water use purposes, under provisions of Section 9 (e), Federal Reclamation Act of 1939,
2. Distribution works, which are the portions of the project which deliver irrigation water to irrigators within a service area, under provisions of Section 9 (d), Federal Reclamation Act of 1939,
3. Water service for other uses, under provisions of Section 9 (c), Federal Reclamation Act of 1939.

Oahe Conservancy Sub-District contractual obligations shall be secured (1) by Conservancy Sub-District authorities and taxing power, (2), by the taxing power of public entities existing under provisions of State Law, (3) by satisfactory contractual arrangements with non-taxing-power public or private entities, all as provided in Chapter 61.14, 1960 Supplement, South Dakota Code of 1939, as amended. This Master Contract must be approved by the Sub-District electorate. This Master Contract will be submitted to a State court for approval under special proceedings. This contract will not become effective without such approvals, by the Sub-District electorate and the court as is provided in State Law.

B. Participating Contracts will be entered into between the Oahe Conservancy Sub-District and each water user entity covering water service through project works. It is anticipated that such individual contracts will be negotiated with all those who obtain water supplies because of construction and operation of the project works. Applicable provisions of the Master Contract will become a part of these Participating Contracts.

Following approval by the Bureau of Reclamation, Participating Contracts with Irrigation Districts and probably other public bodies will be subject to judicial approval by a State Court under special proceedings.

C. Security Contracts will be entered into between an Irrigation District and the United States covering distribution works which contract is designed to become effective only in the event that the Oahe Conservancy Sub-District, for any reason, shall fail to make payments for such distribution works to the United States under this contract. Such Security Contracts must be approved by a State Court before becoming effective as is provided in the Irrigation District laws of South Dakota.

Contracts for Irrigation Water Service

The Master Contract and Participating Contracts with Irrigation Districts will include provisions for the following:

1. Contracts will be combination Section 9 (d) Section 9 (e), Federal Reclamation Act of 1939, type contracts.

2. The contract period will be 40 years for water supply works and 50 years for distribution works of which the first 10 years will comprise the development period and the following 40 years will be the payment period. The development period will start upon a determination by the Secretary of the Interior that construction has been completed for substantially all of the irrigable lands in an operable block of the project and water is available.

3. Provisions under which the United States initially will operate completed usable segments of the project. After consultation with the Sub-District, such completed segments will be transferred to the Sub-District for operation and maintenance. This transfer will be accomplished as soon as practicable.

4. Payment of a development period operation and maintenance charge by and through the Sub-District to the United States, if the operating agency, or for use of the Sub-District, if the operating agency. The development period operation and maintenance annual payment by Irrigation Districts will be nominal during the first year and increase annually to the full water service charge in the tenth year. Deficits during early years of the development period will be paid by the Sub-District from its own tax collections and other revenues. No other water service charges will be required during the development period.

5. Payment of an annual Water Service Charge during the payment period by and through the Conservancy Sub-District, consisting of two parts (1) operation and maintenance charge to the operating agency (The United States or the Conservancy Sub-District whichever is the operating agency) and (2) construction charge to the United States which is an annual installment payment on the project construction investment.

a. Payment of the payment period operation and maintenance charge by Irrigation Districts will be an amount sufficient to cover the costs of operating and maintaining distribution works serving lands within Irrigation Districts, plus a proportionate share of the cost of operating and maintaining the water supply works, including reserves.

b. Payment of a payment period annual construction charge installment by and through the Sub-District to the United States in liquidation of the Federal costs assigned to irrigation for repayment by irrigation water users and the Conservancy Sub-District. Irrigation Districts' payments shall

apply against the cost of the water supply and distribution works until the construction charge obligation on account of construction of the distribution works is fully paid, after which the full annual installment will apply against the cost of the water supply works. At this time, an option will exist to transfer the remaining obligation under water supply works portion of the contracts to a repayment type contract similar to that for repayment of the cost of distribution works. The Sub-District will contract to pay an annual construction charge from its own tax levies to apply against the cost of the water supply works. The amount of the total and annual construction charge for distribution works will be specified in the contracts.

6. Following initiation of construction, the Sub-District will set aside funds in a Development Reserve Fund to meet its obligations particularly during the early years of project operation, and to provide capital for investment in operation and maintenance equipment, material, supplies and operating headquarters.

7. The Sub-District will also provide an Emergency Reserve Fund for major repairs and extraordinary maintenance. This reserve fund is to be accumulated until it reaches a total amount agreed upon by the United States and the Sub-District and maintained reasonably in this total amount. Annual accumulations for this reserve fund will be included in the annual operation and maintenance charge.

8. Annual Water Service Charges (both for operation and maintenance and for construction) will be based upon the classified irrigable lands ability to pay (payment capacity). Assessments for these charges by Irrigation Districts will be made on classified irrigable land only. Irrigable land will be classified as Class 1 (best), Class 2 (second best) and Class 3 (third best). Water Service Charges will be proportional to the capability of each land class to produce under long-term irrigation water application. Annual construction charges and total payments (construction charge obligation), to be specified in

the Master Contract and Participating Contracts, will be negotiated within the payment capacity of the irrigable lands taking into account operation and maintenance charges, Sub-District payments, operating reserves and other pertinent factors.

9. The construction charge obligation to be specified in the Master Contract will be based on the total irrigable area in the Oahe Unit. The construction charge obligation in a Participating Contract with an Irrigation District will be based on the irrigable area assessable by the Irrigation District. The Sub-District and the participating Irrigation Districts, subject to approval of the Bureau of Reclamation, will determine the percentage of the irrigable area which may be initially left out of the Irrigation District, but for which project irrigation delivery is provided. The Sub-District will pay the construction and operation and maintenance charges for the omitted acreage until such acreage, or substituted acreage, is included in the assessable area of the Irrigation District. The Irrigation District in which omitted or substituted acreage is later included will compensate the Sub-District for the construction charge payments which the Sub-District made for such acreage prior to the end of the contract period. The irrigable acreage in each land class will be established prior to the end of the development period prescribed for each Irrigation District.

10. To allow for changes in land classification during the development period, the total construction charge obligation will be established within a range of 15 per cent larger and 15 per cent smaller than a figure based upon the initial irrigable area.

11. The Sub-District will act as guarantor to the United States for payment of construction charges and operation and maintenance charges due the United States under all contracts covering construction operation and maintenance of the water supply and distribution works.

12. The United States will construct the water supply and distribution works upon a determination by the Secretary of the Interior after consultation with the Sub-District that the Master Contract and appropriate Participating Contracts with Irrigation Districts have been

executed to a sufficient extent to insure economical and feasible operation of the water supply and distribution works.

13. Federal law and agency policies require that certain mandatory provisions be included. These cover such items as a non-discrimination clause with respect to employment, that the federal government shall not be liable for damages because of the construction or operation of the project or for water shortages, that water shall not be delivered to excess ownerships of irrigable land, Federal authorization act references, ~~and~~ provisions for inspections of the project works, title to project works, ~~and~~ provisions for contingency on appropriation of funds to carry out the work of the United States, and that Federal officials are not to benefit from contract provisions.

14. It is intended that the South Dakota Conservancy District and the Sub-District will provide consultation and share responsibility for decisions in all phases of planning, construction and operation of the project, and for all authorized purposes to be served.

15. Rights to beneficial use of water shall be governed by the laws of South Dakota and the Federal Reclamation laws. The United States will claim all return flows derived from water furnished under the contract to be used as a source of supply for the Oahe Unit to the extent practicable. At an appropriate time, the United States will initiate water rights acquisition for the project under provisions of South Dakota law, or, in case the Sub-District has secured such rights, transfer of such rights to the United States as is required for project purposes will be arranged.

16. A variable formula for construction charges will be provided which will become effective at the option of the Sub-District and the participating Irrigation Districts. Once this choice of variable payments is made, it must be retained.

17. Provisions whereby the Sub-District may deliver surplus irrigation water to other than classified irrigable land, provided, that such irrigation water deliveries shall not subject the classified irrigable lands to water shortage. Plans, specifications and construction

of such additional facilities will require federal approval. Payment for such irrigation water service will be required in an annual amount sufficient to cover a construction charge toward liquidation of the project construction cost and a proportionate share of operation and maintenance cost. Such irrigation water service shall be subject to all of the limitations as apply to classified irrigable lands and in addition shall be subject to such limitations as the Sub-District and application of the water laws of South Dakota may prescribe. Delivery of irrigation water to such other land will not prevent their classification as irrigable lands if such designation is warranted.

Contracts for Non-Irrigation Water Service

The Master Contract will contain provisions and Participating Contracts will be prepared for use of water for municipal and industrial and miscellaneous purposes under Section 9 (c), Federal Reclamation Act of 1939, provided, that the use of water for such purposes shall not create water shortages for irrigation purposes.

1. Municipal and Industrial water supplies may be contracted subject to payments annually of water service charges which shall be sufficient to cover an appropriate share of the annual operation and maintenance cost and an appropriate share of the cost of construction of the water supply works. Municipal and industrial water service made available because of the construction of the irrigation project will be delivered at such locations and under such conditions as are specified in each Participating Contract.

2. Fish, Wildlife and Recreation water service purposes may be served also. The United States will reimburse the Sub-District either by cash payment or appropriate credit, for the proportionate share of annual operation and maintenance costs of the project works used in making water service deliveries for these purposes, whether or not water is supplied directly from the project system or indirectly through use of return flows. These waters will be supplied at such locations, at such times and under such conditions as are specified in the Master Contract if water service for these purposes is rendered to or on behalf of the United States or as specified in each Participating Contract if service is rendered to, or on behalf of individuals or

entities other than agencies of the United States. Water service for these purposes shall not conflict with use for irrigation purposes.

3. Water service will be provided for minor miscellaneous purposes for which project cost allocations have not been made. These minor miscellaneous purposes include stockwater, ground water recharge, pollution dilution, or similar water uses. Annual water service charges for specific water deliveries for these purposes will include a charge to cover a proportionate share of project annual operation and maintenance costs and such other charges as may be fixed by the United States and the Sub-District. Participating Contracts will specify the conditions under which these minor miscellaneous purposes may receive water service.

4. Approval of all Participating Contracts by the United States will be required. Participating Contracts will be required by the Sub-District for all identifiable water supplies which become available because of construction of the irrigation project whether such water supplies are furnished by direct deliveries from the project works or through project return flows.

5. Water supplies for miscellaneous purposes may be limited to periods of off-peak irrigation water demands, the timing of such deliveries being at the option of the Sub-District with due regard to adequacy of service.

At its July 17th meeting of the Commission, an application for 35.65 c.f.s. of water to irrigate 2800 acres of lands in Hughes and Sully County was considered.

The lands, shown on the enclosed map, when compared with your future use withdrawal map, seem to be covered in your future use withdrawal. While the application was not advertised a part of your future use withdrawal, the Commission felt that this application comes under the same category as the Gray Goose application.

We would appreciate the Oahe Sub-District Board's concurrence to approval of this application as part of your future use Permit No. 1076-3.

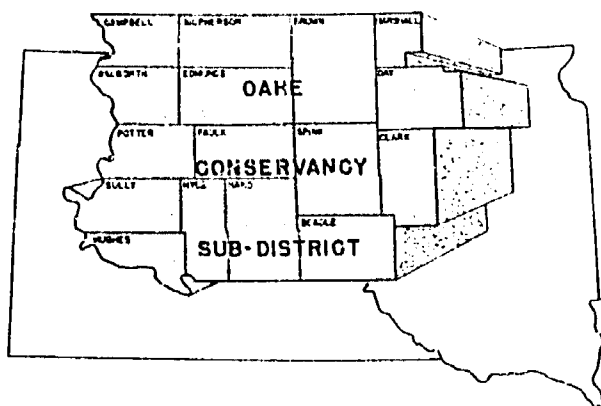

- (a) 1,440 cfs of Missouri River water (Lake Oahe) to be diverted by the proposed Oahe Pumping Plant.
- (b) 500 cfs of James River waters to be diverted by the proposed James Pumping Plant.
- (c) 14,000 acre-feet annually from Cresbard Creek.
- (d) 16,000 acre-feet annually from Foster Creek.
- (e) 16,800 acre-feet annually from Medicine Knoll Creek. (Mistakenly identified as North Medicine Knoll Creek in Water Permit No. 1067-3.)
- (f) 446,000 acre-feet (inactive storage space) for initial fill of the proposed Blunt Reservoir with a dam across Medicine Knoll Creek. (Location of dam mistakenly shown as across North Medicine Knoll Creek in Water Permit No. 1067-3.)
- (g) 1,100 acre-feet for initial fill (inactive storage space) of the proposed Cresbard Reservoir with a dam across Cresbard Creek.
- (h) 5,100 acre-feet (inactive storage space) for initial fill of the proposed enlargement of Lake Byron with the Byron Dam across Foster Creek.

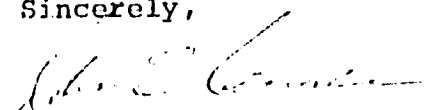

Dear Mr. May:

This letter is in reference to our discussion in this office March 5, 1979 and to answer the questions raised in your letter dated March 5, 1979 concerning Future Use Permit 1067-3 and James River Permits. This letter should also further clarify statements in our letter dated February 27, 1979.

Although James River water is involved in the water reserved by Future Use Permit No. 1067-3, the permit is predicated or conditioned upon Missouri River water (stored water) being delivered to public type projects built using such reserved water. If Missouri water is delivered to the James River, the Oahe Sub-District has a right to certain James River water. If Missouri water is not delivered to the James River then Permit No. 1067-3 does not include James River water.

The above is based upon a review of Future Use Permit No. 1067-3, testimony presented at the time of the hearing on the application and other available information. The above statement will be explained in more detail in the answers to your questions as follows:

1. Future Use Permit No. 1067-3 was originally approved to reserve Missouri River water (stored water) for the Oahe Project. Reservation of water under Future Use Permit No. 1067-3 included Missouri River water, but also the reservation of such Missouri water after it entered the James River, to allow for subsequent diversion of up to 7000 cfs at the James Diversion Dam. During high water years in the James River, less Missouri water would be released into the James River, since a portion of the 7000 cfs would be James River water (usually flood flows) since lower water flows in the James River would not satisfy the project requirements.

During the time that Application No. 1067-3 was being considered, it was determined that while it was questionable that approval would affect subsequent individual applications, Permit No. 1067-3 should be mentioned when considering any individual applications. The reason being that, as envisioned, with the amount of water involved under Future Use Permit No. 1067-3, individual irrigation would probably not be a factor when considering other losses including evaporation and seepage. In the event that individual irrigation withdrawals did increase (for example, from 300 cfs to 1000 cfs) to possibly become a factor, then it may have been necessary from time to time to augment James River flows with additional Missouri water for individual irrigation projects. This would have been done under some form of contract.

Testimony at the time that Application No. 1067-3 was considered was that the application was filed to establish a priority date for the use of Missouri River water (stored water) in the event that at some future date Missouri water was at a premium. It was further stated that Permit No. 1067-3 provides for a water right only if the Oahe Project is built. It was also stated that, if in the future, it appears that the Oahe Sub-District has requested an excessive amount of water over and above the projects anticipated by the Oahe Sub-District, that portion in excess will be released for Water Rights Commission action. It was also stated that Permit No. 1067-3 provides for a Water Right only if the project (Oahe) is built and that Permit No. 1067-3 was approved to implement the Oahe Project, if built.

2. Priority for Future Use Permit No. 1067-3 is November 7, 1963.
3. Although Application No. 1067-3 included the right to divert up to 7000 cfs at the James Diversion Dam, the right to 7000 cfs was contingent upon delivery of sufficient Missouri water upstream to allow the diversion at the James Diversion Dam. Although natural James River flows during higher water years would be part of the water diverted at the James Diversion Dam, the James River channel was to actually be used as part of the project delivery system to deliver Missouri water for project use east of the James River. Rights provided under Permit No. 1067-3 were to protect Missouri water once delivered to the James River from appropriation and use prior to being diverted downstream. Rights to natural James River flows only were not granted under Future Use Permit No. 1067-3.

Use of Natural James River flows as a sole source of water for a project was not the intent of Permit No. 1067-3. James River flow records for example show that a total flow of the James River at Huron in 1959 was 400 acre feet. During 1977, irrigation above Huron was shut off on May 11th.

4. The Oahe Sub-District has no rights to any James River flows other than those flows diverted at the James Diversion Dam as part of a delivery system to deliver Missouri water (would include James River water in high water years) for project use east of the James River.
5. Individual applications since November 7, 1963 are subject to Permit No. 1067-3 as explained above.
6. There are no James River permits in conflict with Permit No. 1067-3 at this time. If projects are built in the future which deliver Missouri water to the James River for diversion downstream to projects east of the James River, then there could be a conflict during low James River water years (for example, 1959, 1976, and 1977).

Without Missouri water, James River irrigators are shut off in dry years. If a Missouri water delivery project was built to use water reserved under Permit No. 1067-3, then there would be two choices for individual James River irrigators during dry years: (1) shut off, or (2) enter into a contract for project water from the Missouri through the project delivery system which in their case, the delivery system would include the James River channel.

7. A report on the James River and James River Water Rights was presented at the May 13-14, 1965 Commission meeting. At that time, the Commission determined that up to 300 cfs (200 cfs above Huron and 100 cfs below) of irrigation permits with an August 10th cutoff date could be authorized from the James River. Flow records indicated that 300 cfs would be available for irrigation at least 6 or 7 years (possibly 8 years) out of a 10 year period on an average. Using a July 1 cutoff date several hundred additional cfs could be approved. The Commission determined that it would allow up to 300 cfs for irrigation from the James River. Additional irrigation permits with a July 1 cutoff date have not been considered. Additional applications were placed in a deferred status, retaining their priority in anticipation that water for the deferred applications would become available through cancellation or reduction of existing permits or from new sources of water. In setting the above limits, the Commission has used 46-2-10 and 46-2-11 as its authority.
8. To deny or reject all pending James River applications would jeopardize the priority dates of all applicants, and in effect, penalize the people who planned ahead. To decide to reject the applications at this time rather than to keep them in a deferred status whereby they retain the priority, would be an arbitrary decision on the part of the Commission. Courts have held that the Commission actions shall be reasonable and not arbitrary. We believe the present deferred procedure is a reasonable and fair method of water management. There is good reason to defer James River Applications due to future additional water uncertainties in the James River. Since there are uncertainties on the availability of additional James River water, the Commission is not in a position to make a decision to approve James River applications in accordance with 46-5-21 or to reject such applications in accordance with 46-5-22.
9. Despite statements that the applications were not complete without soil-water compatibility approval from the Conservation Commission, and that the new fee schedule should apply, legal advice to the Commission at the time 46-5-6.2 through 46-5-6.8 (Conservation Commission) and 46-2-13 (fees) became law, stated that applications received prior to the effective date of the Acts did not require such approval, and were subject to the fees in effect upon the date of receipt of such application.
10. The Department of Natural Resources is in the process of reviewing all available data on the James River, and what effects the Garrison Project will have on South Dakota.

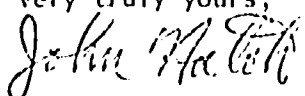
Future Use Permit No. 1067-3 states that the 800,000 acres to be irrigated would consist of 482,000 acre of project lands, plus an additional 318,000 acres which can be developed and served from the project works. Therefore, the future Use Permit was approved for public type projects only, not for individual irrigation project development.

Finally, unless projects are built to use Missouri water reserved under Permit No. 1067-3, the permit would be subject to cancellation for non-development. There should be no reason that Permit No. 1067-3 can not be amended and modified, if necessary,

as long as the modifications were within the original general conditions of the permit, and any modification was not in conflict with subsequent rights, and are in the public interest.

We hope the above provide answers to the questions asked.

3. Subsequent to the 1968 Public Notice in paragraph 2, above, applications numbered, 1914-3, 1915-3, 2628-3, 2629-3, 2623-3, 2635-3,

2640-3, 2641-3, 2642-3, 2643-3, 2645-3, 2654-3, 2873-3, 2874-3, 2877-3, 2879-3, 2880-3, 4066-3, 4067-3, 4068-3, 4069-3, 4072-3, and 4073-3 were filed with the Water Rights Commission. Filing dates for these applications for diversion from the James River ranged from December 14, 1971 to January 28, 1977. The total amount of water requested from the James River equalled 90.66 c.f.s., sufficient to irrigate 6,445.9 acres of land.

4. No action was taken on the applications specified in paragraph 3 until November and December, 1978, and in January, 1979. During these months the applicants were instructed by the staff of the Water Rights Commission to publish a notice of public hearing, which public hearing was to be held January 31, 1979.

5. On or about December 6, 1978, John Hatch, Chief Engineer, Water Rights Commission, mailed out a letter to applicants as specified in paragraph 3 above which letter stated in part; "The Commission has directed the staff to advertise the pending applications for hearing, so official action can be taken. Water conditions have not changed on the James River, and no water is presently available for appropriation."

6. At the January 31, 1979 Hearing, the Oahe Sub-district appeared and protested the taking of any action on said applications other than to reject such applications.

7. Chief Engineer, John Hatch, testified that none of the applications specified in paragraph 3 had been approved by the South Dakota Department of Agriculture as required by, S.D.C.L. 46-5-6.5, and testified that none of the applications were required to comply with the 1977 amendments to S.D.C.L. 46-5-6.2 through 6.8, because such applications were filed prior to such amendments.

8. The evidence revealed that regarding applications numbered 2628-3, 2629-3, 2632-3, 2635-3, 2640-3, 2641-3, 2642-3, 2643-3, 2645-3, 2654-3, 2873-3, 2874-3, 2877-3, 2879-3, 2880-3, 4066-3, 4067-3, 4068-3, 4072-3 and 4073-3, such applications did not comply with the law in effect at the date of their filing, and on or about December 6, 1978, John Hatch, Chief Engineer, Water Rights Commission, contacted each such applicant by letter to notify such applicant of

the lack of a proper map, filing fee or other deficiency in said application, and some of the applications specified in this paragraph were corrected to conform with pre-1977 law.

9. At the Hearing of January 31, 1979, it was found that conditions have not changed on the James River since 1968 and that currently there is no unappropriated water available for the applications specified in paragraph 3, above.

10. The Commission found that if any water becomes available, the Sub-district's Future Use Permit, with a priority date of November 7, 1963, would utilize any further additions or unappropriated water that might become available, and it was found that to grant the applications specified in paragraph 3, a priority date and a specified quantity of water, would cause a conflict with the Sub-district's Future Use Permit.

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact the Water Rights Commission makes the following Conclusions of Law:

1. The Water Rights Commission has jurisdiction to consider and reject the applications specified in paragraph 3 of the Findings of Fact, above.
2. Findings of Fact 1 through 10, are all based on substantial evidence.
3. The Oahe Conservancy Sub-district is an interested party in this action and the Hearing of January 31, 1979, was a contested case, as those terms are used under the South Dakota Administrative Procedure Act.
4. Based on S.D.C.L. 46-5-22 which states:

If, in the opinion of the Commission, there is no unappropriated water available, it shall reject such application.

the applications specified in paragraph 3 of the Findings of Fact above, for permits to divert water from the James River in South Dakota, must be rejected, and the Water Rights Commission has no jurisdiction to "defer" such applications.

5. The Future Use Permit of the Oahe Conservancy Sub-district must, under law, be used to allocate any water not currently

appropriated which becomes available on the James River, up to the amount granted thereunder, as required by law.

6. The applications specified in paragraph 3 above are required by law to comply with S.D.C.L. 46-5-6.2 through 6.8 and all subsequent amendments and each such application must be approved by the S.D. Department of Agriculture.

7. Since such applications do not comply with S.D.C.L. 46-5-6.2 through 6.8 they must be rejected.

8. No further applications for appropriation from the James River between the North Dakota - South Dakota boundary and the North boundary of Yankton County shall be accepted by the Water Rights Commission, until unappropriated water becomes available.

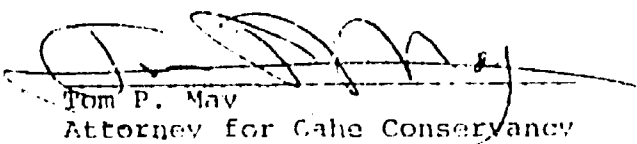

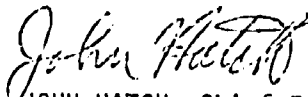

This will acknowledge your letter and suggested possible meeting date. Your letter indicates a meeting the week of January 26, I believe that you meant that to be this week, February 26. If this letter is not too late, we could meet the end of this week, March 2 in the afternoon, or else March 9, in afternoon. We will answer the questions as you posed them.

1. Future use Permit No. 1067-3 as issued, envisioned this Future Use Right as a reservation of certain waters for project type development. We do not believe it was intended to be used for individual type systems. Individual system applications would be handled by the Water Rights Commission, individually on a water availability basis. The Commission can consider applications received after a future use permit is granted, subject to development under such future use.
2. Specific applications for use of all or any part of your future use withdrawal must be approved prior to development of a project.
3. Utilization of the future use withdrawal would be through feasible projects.
4. Flood flows would be available and usable under this future use withdrawal. Normally this would involve storage. Normal irrigation season flows should probably be reserved for individual type systems. Return flows are subject to appropriation after they enter a natural water course. Augmented flows, over and above return flows, we believe would be on a contract basis with the Garrison project or similar project. Use of such waters would require a permit. We do not believe that such augmented flows would be covered by Future Use Permit No. 1067-3.

Enclosed please find the Oahe Sub-district's proposed "Findings of Fact," "Conclusions of Law" and "Decision" regarding certain water rights applications on the James River. This is intended as service by mailing.

Please understand that copies of these are being sent to all individuals with applications for James River Water permits listed on page two. It is our understanding that the January 31, 1979, Water Rights Commission Hearing on these applications, the Commission granted a formal "deferred" status to these applications, as was predicted in Mr. Hatch's letter dated December 6, 1978, written to all applicants listed on page two.

The Sub-district disagrees with the procedure that the Commission used to grant this "deferred" status, and believes the Commission exceeded what is allowed by the law. For this reason, the enclosed papers are being filed to record the Sub-district's position in this matter.

As the Sub-district understands it, the Commission acted favorably on the applications of those shown on page two.

The Subdistrict is not against the individuals receiving irrigation water, under proper conditions, and the Sub-district supports the utilization of James River water for irrigation and other purposes. The obligation of the Sub-district, owed to all potential James River water users requires, however, that we file the enclosed papers to make a complete record. This obligation rests on the fact that any increases in James River flows will be limited, and should be distributed in a fair manner and in compliance with the law.

The Oahe Conservancy Sub-district holds a James River Future Use Permit, with a priority date of November 1963, which should take priority over these applications.

We believe the applicants below should go through the Sub-district's Future Use Permit, in a manner that is fair and equitable to all potential water users. The benefit under this procedure would be to give all applicants who complied with the law a priority of 1963.

If Garrison water is being considered as a potential source for Irrigation from the James River, the Sub-district feels that no applications should be considered until the amount, quality and timing of Garrison water is certain. At that time, applications should come through the Oahe Sub-district in order to utilize the 1963 priority date, and to assure local input on equitable allocation.

It is for these reasons that the Sub-district filed the enclosed documents.

This letter is on behalf of the Oahe Conservancy Sub-district and is to inform the South Dakota Water Rights Commission of the Sub-district's position regarding its 1963 Future Use Permit, 1067-3, as such Permit pertains to the James River. This letter is also to inform the Commission of the Sub-district's position on the status of private applications for use of James River water, which applications are currently on file with the Water Rights Commission. Finally this letter will serve as notice of the Sub-district's position on the potential water that will enter South Dakota on account of the Garrison Project in North Dakota.

The Sub-district requests the South Dakota Water Rights Commission and staff to use their legal authority to grant the following requests.

1. The Commission is asked to reconfirm the fact that Future Use Permit, 1067-3, provides for use of James River water on any of the lands specified by legal description in the application for Permit 1067-3.
2. The Commission is asked to reconfirm the priority date of November 7, 1963, granted to Permit 1067-3.
3. The Commission is asked to reconfirm the specific quantity of James River water reserved under Future Use Permit 1067-3.

4. The Commission is asked to reconfirm the fact that Future Use Permit 1067-3, provides for diversions of natural flows (12 months) flood flows, return flows (12 months), augmented flows (12 months), and any water in the James River on account of the Garrison Project in North Dakota.

5. The Commission is requested to provide by rule or order that all permits henceforth granted on the James River will be processed through and subject to the Sub-district's Future Use Permit 1067-3.

6. The Commission is asked to review all permits granted since 1963 which allow diversions from the James River, in order to determine which permits conflict with the Sub-district's Future Use Permit 1067-3.

7. The Commission is requested to provide by order or rule that no pending applications for diversions from the James River, will be granted a "formal deferred" status.

8. The Commission is asked to reject all pending applications for diversions from the James River, and specifically the Commission is asked to reject the 23 applications considered at the January 31, 1979, meeting of the Water Rights Commission at which meeting said permits were granted a "formal deferred" status.

9. As an alternative to the request of the Sub-district in paragraph 8, above, the Commission is requested to order that all pending applications for diversions from the James River be required to comply with the existing law regarding application fees, soil and water analysis and all legal requirements.

10. The Commission is requested to direct the staff to prepare an in-depth report on the potential use and impact of Garrison Project water in South Dakota, and to direct that the staff cooperate with the Oahe Conservancy Sub-district, the Lower James Conservancy Sub-district, and all interested parties. Such report should, at a minimum cover potential quality, quantity, and timing of Garrison water, and should determine whether such water would be return flows, augmented flows, waste water or other types of flows. The report should make recommendations on how to best utilize such Garrison waters to protect and serve the interests of South Dakota residents.

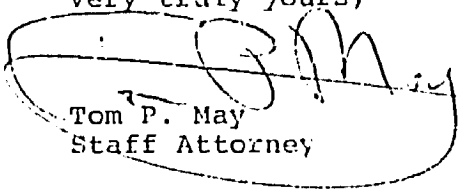

Pursuant to SDCL 46A-2-33, the Board of Water & Natural Resources acting as the governing board for the SD Conservancy District has the power to exercise authority for the subdistrict boards of directors upon their dissolution in 1984. Currently, there are five existing future use permits reserving water and three deferred future use permit applications on file with the Water Rights Program in the name of Conservancy Subdistricts. This letter is to inform the Board of Water and Natural Resources, acting on behalf of the South Dakota Conservancy District, of this fact and to determine the interest in retaining these permits for future development.

The following lists the permits and applications.

State water rights law affords entities such as the SD Conservancy District, Water Development Districts, municipalities, nonprofit rural water supply companies, irrigation districts or sanitary districts to reserve water for contemplated future needs. By law, future use permits are to be reviewed by the Board of Water Management every 7 years to determine if a reasonable need for the permit still exists. In the case of these old subdistrict permits, the seven year review has not occurred except for Future Use Permit No. 1442-2 (see below).

Existing Future Use Permits

Future Use Permit No. 1442-2 was intended and has been used for the West River / Lyman Jones Rural Water System project. The West River Water Development District has actively participated by applying to construct and place to beneficial use reserved water although with the dissolution of the West River Conservancy Subdistrict, the authority for the permit is held by the SD Conservancy District. The Water Development District has further sought to retain the future use permit during the statutory seven year review by demonstrating a reasonable need to retain the permit. This permit may be transferred to the West River Water Development District as the logical heir for the purpose the reserved water was obtained. Does the Board of Water and Natural Resources acting on behalf of the South Dakota Conservancy District concur with the transfer of this Permit No. 1442-2 to West River Water Development District?

With respect to the other future use permits, these permits are to be reviewed by the Board of Water Management every seven years to determine whether a reasonable need exists for the reserved water. From DENR's perspective, there has not been a concerted effort to develop the intended projects since at least the early 1980's.

If the plan is to retain these future use permits, the permits will be public noticed in the counties where water would either be diverted or used, for review before the Board of Water Management pursuant to SDCL 46-5-38.1. The purpose of this review is to determine if a reasonable need exists for retaining the permit. Notice will be given of the hearing time and place at a future date.

If the SD Conservancy District does not intend to retain the future use permit, it may be transferred to a qualifying entity as set forth in SDCL 46-5-38. A notice of transfer of ownership will need to be filed. The entity taking possession will then be responsible to demonstrate a reasonable need for the reserved water as well as the public notice and fees associated with the seven year review.

The fee is dependent on the amount of reserved water allowed to remain in effect after the hearing before the Board of Water Management. The fee for retaining a future use permit is approximately \$10 for each 120 acre feet of water allowed to remain in reserve.

If the SD Conservancy District does not plan to retain the future use permit and no successor is found, the future use permit will be subject to cancellation. Notice of hearing on any cancellation proceeding will be provided to the District.

Pending Applications

The Oahe Conservancy Subdistrict also applied for three applications to reserve water for future use that did not receive final action by the Board of Water Management. Application Nos. 4987-3 and 4201-3 were contested. If there is no intent to proceed with these projects, the best course of action is to withdraw the applications from further consideration. The withdrawal would then be scheduled for formal acknowledgement by the Board of Water Management.

If there is still an interest in obtaining the future use permits, the applications will need to be public noticed again since many of the original petitioners can no longer be found. If the applications are approved they would become subject to the review every seven years as outlined above.

To summarize, there are a number of future use permits and applications that the SD Conservancy District gained authority over upon dissolution of the Subdistricts. The Water Rights Program of DENR is inquiring to the Board of Water and Natural Resources in its capacity as the South Dakota Conservancy District the following regarding the permits/applications.

1. Is the District agreeable to the transfer of Future Use Permit No. 1442-2 to the West River Water Development District?
2. Is there any intent to develop water reserved under existing future use permits? If so, the statutory seven year review will need to be conducted.
3. Is there any intent to pursue future use permits for those applications that have not received Board of Water Management approval?

Please respond in writing by April 15, 2012 regarding the Conservancy District's intention for the future use permits and applications. If the Conservancy District desires to retain any or all of the future use permits, the response should outline a reasonable need for the future use permits by the project associated with that reservation of water, including an estimate of future needs.

AUTHORIZING THE CANCELLATION OF SELECT FUTURE USE PERMITS, FUTURE USE PERMIT APPLICATIONS, AND THE TRANSFER OF ONE FUTURE USE PERMIT AND TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES (DENR) TO SUBMIT THE NECESSARY PAPERWORK TO COMPLETE THESE CANCELLATIONS AND TRANSFER.

WHEREAS, the 1984 Legislative special session dissolved the conservancy subdistricts and transferred their remaining administrative functions to the Board of Water and Natural Resources (Board); and,

WHEREAS, Future Use Permits 1067-3, 1094-3, 1955-3, 1157-1, 1442-2 were subsequently transferred to the Board (acting in its capacity as the South Dakota Conservancy Subdistrict); and,

WHEREAS, there are three pending Future Use Permit Applications 4987-3, 4381-3, and 4201-3 that were never formally acted upon by the Board of Water Management; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to SDCL 46-5-38.1, Future Use permits are to be reviewed by the Board of Water Management every seven years to determine if there exists a reasonable need to retain the permits; and,

WHEREAS, the Future Use permits and Future Use Permit applications referenced above are scheduled to be reviewed in the near future by the Board of Water Management; and,

WHEREAS, Future Use Permit 1442-2 is the only permit that a portion of the reserved water has been put to beneficial use and there is a continuing reasonable need to retain the remaining reserved water held by the permit; and,

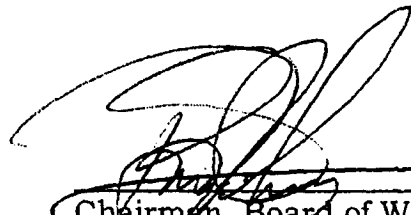

On March 9, 2012 the Board of Water and Natural Resources adopted Resolution #2012 – 13 authorizing the cancellation of the referenced future use permits and withdrawal of future use permit applications on deferred status. Therefore, the Chief Engineer of the Water Rights Program is recommending cancellation of Future Use Permit Nos. 1067-3, 1094-3, 1955-3 and 1157-1 and withdrawal of Future Use Application Nos. 4987-3, 4381-3 and 4201-3.

The Water Management Board will consider cancellation and withdrawal of the above referenced permits and applications at 10:00 a.m., May 2, 2012 in the Floyd Matthew Training Center, Joe Foss Building, 523 E Capitol, Pierre, SD. Attached are the Chief Engineer's recommendations. The agenda time is an estimate and the actual time of hearing may be later than 10:00 a.m.

The cancellation and withdrawal are without prejudice to the ability to seek and obtain a new water permit or future use permit from the Missouri River or its tributaries under any state or federal laws or authorizations. Nothing in this cancellation is intended to waive South Dakota's rights or the rights of any of its agencies or water right holders under any state or federal laws.

The recommendations of the Chief Engineer are not final or binding upon the Board. The Board is authorized to 1) cancel or withdraw, 2) cancel or withdraw portions of, 3) delay action on, or 4) take no action on Permit Nos. 1067-3, 1094-3, 1955-3 and 1157-1 and Application Nos. 4987-3, 4381-3 and 4201-3 based upon facts presented at the public hearing. Our records show South Dakota Conservancy District to be the rightful holder of these permits and applications. If the Conservancy District wishes

to oppose the cancellations or withdrawals in this matter and intends to participate in the hearing before the Board and present evidence or cross-examine witnesses according to SDCL 1-26, a written petition shall be filed with the Chief Engineer by April 23, 2012. The petition may be informal, but it must include a statement describing the reasons for opposition to the cancellations and/or withdrawals, and a signature and mailing address or your legal counsel if legal counsel is obtained.

The hearing will be conducted pursuant to the provisions of SDCL 46-1-1 thru 46-1-10, 46-1-14 thru 46-1-15; 46-2-3.1, 46-2-9, 46-2-11, 46-2-17; 46-5-36, 46-5-37, 46-5-37.1; 46-2A-1 thru 46-2A-7; and Board Rules ARSD 74:02:01:36 thru 74:02:01:41. These are contested cases pursuant to procedures contained in SDCL 1-26.

This hearing may be an adversarial proceeding. Any party has the right to be present or to be represented by a lawyer. These and other due process rights will be forfeited if they are not exercised. Decisions of the Board may be appealed to the Circuit Court and State Supreme Court as provided by law.

The time of the hearing will be automatically extended for at least twenty days upon written request to the Chief Engineer after a petition has been filed to oppose the cancellation and/or withdrawal. If an extension is requested, the hearing will be continued until the next regular Board Meeting. Any request for extension must be filed with the Chief Engineer by April 23, 2012.

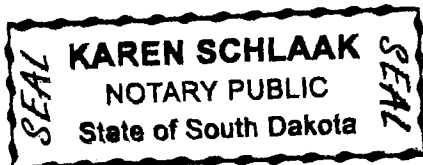
